#### THE FIELD MANAGEMENT TRACK

The OFA Professional Fellowship is a five-week educational and training program designed for people interested in building their management skills and pursuing leadership positions in the progressive world.

The field management track of the program seeks to accomplish four key goals. By the end of the program you will:



Understand the role that a field manager plays at a progressive organization, and the strategic goals of a field program



Be able to write, adapt, and manage a people-centered, datadriven field plan



Feel confident hiring and managing a team of field organizers to execute your field plan



Be one click away - whether that is a Google search or an email to an expert - to any related question that might come up



### PROGRAM CURRICULUM

### FIELD MANAGEMENT 101 | Tuesday, October 6th

As a field organizer you were responsible for executing a field plan under the guidance of your regional field director or organizing director. As a field manager for a ballot measure campaign, you are responsible for writing the field plan that your team of organizers will execute. In this session you will learn what is the role of a field manager, and understand the basic framework of a ballot measure field plan.

#### CREATING A VOTER UNIVERSE | Tuesday, October 13th

Your field plan revolves around a win number, which is the total number of votes you need in order to win on Election Day. However, resources, staff, and time are always limited and you are not likely to talk to every single expected voter. As a field manager you will likely learn from a data team which voters you need to talk to in order to get 50%+1. In this session you will learn what criteria is considered by the data team when creating a voter universe.

### GETTING TO YOUR WIN NUMBER | Tuesday, October 20th

Once you lock your voter universe, you must determine how you will invest resources, allocate staff, and work with volunteers to talk to all your targets at least once by Election Day. In this session you will learn what to consider when writing your targeting strategy – who you should target, how you should target them, and at what point in the cycle.

### CREATING CAPACITY | Tuesday, October 27th

Campaigns typically do not have the resources or time to talk to and turn out their entire voter universe using only staff. In this session you will learn how to build a strong and sustainable organizing model that allows you to integrate volunteers, political leaders, different constituencies, and staff in order to talk to everyone in your voter universe at least once by Election Day.



### PROGRAM CURRICULUM

### BUILDING A RAMP AND TIMELINE | Tuesday, November 3rd

Any campaign is like a ramp -- the closer you get to Election Day, the more resources, capacity and voter attention you have. Your field plan must follow this ramp accordingly. In this session you will learn how to create a timeline that uses resources, builds capacity, and talks to voters incrementally from day one through Election Day.

#### **BUILDING YOUR TEAM |** Thursday, November 5<sup>th</sup>

Hiring a team of rockstars is one of the most important aspects of your field plan. In this session you will learn what qualities to consider when hiring a team of organizers, as well as how to structure a job interview that helps you identify the must-haves over the nice-to-haves.

#### MANAGING YOUR TEAM | Tuesday, November 10th

While team members come together under the leadership of a manager, not all team members bring the same experiences, skills, and personalities to the team. In this session you will learn how to manage each member of your team effectively by considering their various skills and personalities, while helping them achieve their maximum potential.

#### WHAT YOU WILL LEARN

The Chicago Practicum is a unique opportunity for Professional Fellows to experience the role of a professional field manager. On Friday, November 13<sup>th</sup>, you will participate in a day-long simulation where you will use skills learned throughout the online phase of the program to solve scenarios typically experienced by field managers. Throughout the simulation you will receive first-hand coaching from organizing experts.

#### RESUME WRITING FOR FIELD MANAGERS

Not all resumes are equal. The two-day practicum concludes with a hands-on resume and writing session. You will leave Chicago with a resume that highlights your talents as an organizer and field manager.

#### SIMULATION-BASED LEARNING

As part of the Fellowship, you will engage in a program-long simulation. This means that all of your weekly assignments, including your Chicago Practicum experiential activities, will take place in the context of a fictional non-profit organization, where you work as a field director. By engaging in this simulation, you will be exposed to real-world situations you are likely to confront as a field director a progressive organization. Read on to learn more about the fictional organization for which you work, and your role as a field director.

#### **WELCOME TO CLIMATE STRONG**

Welcome to Climate STRONG (CS), a national, non-partisan climate-advocacy organization. CS is enthusiastically growing the climate movement by training, educating, and mobilizing community members across the country. We strive to hold decision makers accountable for their stances on climate and the key votes they take on the issue. As a grassroots driven organization, Climate STRONG is committed to utilizing digital tools to provide climate organizers with the skills and tools needed to turn climate-change denial into something that is socially and politically unacceptable.

#### YOUR ROLE AS A FIELD MANAGER AT CLIMATE STRONG

As a field director at Climate STRONG you are running a climate issue campaign. You are responsible for writing a campaign plan to get the organization's message out through direct voter contact. Your main responsibility is to develop a comprehensive plan that includes knocking on doors and phone banking to identify voters and persuade them for the issue campaigns Climate STRONG works on. You are also responsible for hiring and managing the team of organizers who will help you execute the campaign.

You will learn more about the specific campaign parameters during your webinars. You will ultimately develop and write a comprehensive field plan. Each week, you will produce one section of the plan based on what you learned in class.






